The project examines the process and content of the service sector liberalisation in a selected number of Asian, African and Caribbean countries (Commonwealth Members) with a special focus on domestic regulation. The main objectives of the project are the following:

- (1) Provide a review of the services sector, its contribution to the national economy, international competitiveness, and potentials for further growth and trade
- (2) Explore the current state of domestic regulation of services in the countries under consideration and their enforcement

- (3) Study the GATS commitments of these countries and examine their experiences and progress in fulfilling these commitments and the implications of their commitments, including any additional fiscal burden for implementing the relevant reforms
- (4) Identify sectors/activities where unilateral liberalisation, either complete and/or partial, has taken place without making any formal GATS commitments and how the existing domestic regulation has influenced these sectors/activities.
- (5) Assess if the absence of suitable regulatory framework/practices pose certain challenges for the liberalised sectors, other protected activities, as well as overall macroeconomic management
- (6) Analyse the scope of the service sector liberalisation in these countries and their potential consequences (in terms of employment generation, productivity gains in manufacturing and agricultural activities, changes in welfare, etc)
- (7) Assess the implications of further liberalisation in the absence of an efficient and adequate regulatory mechanism
- (8) Suggest ways to improve the regulatory mechanisms (including institutional frameworks, reforms and fiscal implications) in these countries in order to derive maximum benefits (in terms of better access by the poor, among others) from services liberalisation

ON GOING RESEARCH PROJECTS

- **The Future of the Global Economy: Regional Trajectories and Global Institutions** (in collaboration with Prof Manmohan Agarwal, Center for Study on Diplomacy, International Law and Economics, Jawaharlal Nehru University)

This project aims to predict the nature of the Global Economy 25 years from now. It attempts to do so by adopting the following method:

1. A disaggregation of the Global Economy into certain regional economic blocs based on certain rational criteria and detailed study of these blocs regarding growth, poverty, inequality, composition of output and trade, technological progress and development.
2. The interactions between the various blocs with the global economy to find the effect of globalisation on these blocs as well as the effect on the global economy because of the participation of these blocs.
3. The effect of international institutions (the IMF, World Bank, WTO) and laws (like IPRs) that govern economic globalisation on the various blocs as well as the global economy.

The first part of this project is nearing completion with the conference volume on Regional Trajectories being compiled.
